

**ARTICLE 34.00  
VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES**

**Section 34.01 PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION**

Any person, persons, firm or corporation or anyone acting in behalf of the same, who shall violate, neglect, or refuse to comply with or who resists the enforcement of any of the provisions of this Ordinance or conditions of the Planning Commission, the Zoning Board of Appeals or the Township Board adopted pursuant thereto, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to punishment by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) and the costs of prosecution or by ninety (90) days imprisonment in the County jail or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court, together with the costs of such prosecution.

**Section 34.02 EACH DAY A SEPARATE OFFENSE**

Each day that a violation is committed, occurs or permitted to exist or continue shall constitute a separate offense.

**Section 34.03 SENTENCE NOT EXEMPTION**

The imposition of any sentence shall not exempt the offender from compliance with the requirements of this Ordinance. Uses of land, and dwellings, buildings, or structures, including tents, trailer coaches and mobile homes used, erected, altered, razed, or converted in violation of any provision of this Ordinance, are hereby declared to be nuisance per se.

**Section 34.04 PUBLIC NUISANCE PER SE**

Any violation of the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be a public nuisance per se. The court shall order such nuisance abated and the person, persons, firm or corporation or anyone acting in behalf of the same violating said provisions shall be adjudged guilty of maintaining a nuisance per se.

**Section 34.05 RELIEF FROM PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY**

An employee or consultant working on behalf of the Township shall not be personally liable while acting for the Township and is hereby relieved from all personal liability from any damage that may accrue to persons or property as a result of any act required or permitted in the discharge of their official duties in regards to this Ordinance.
